

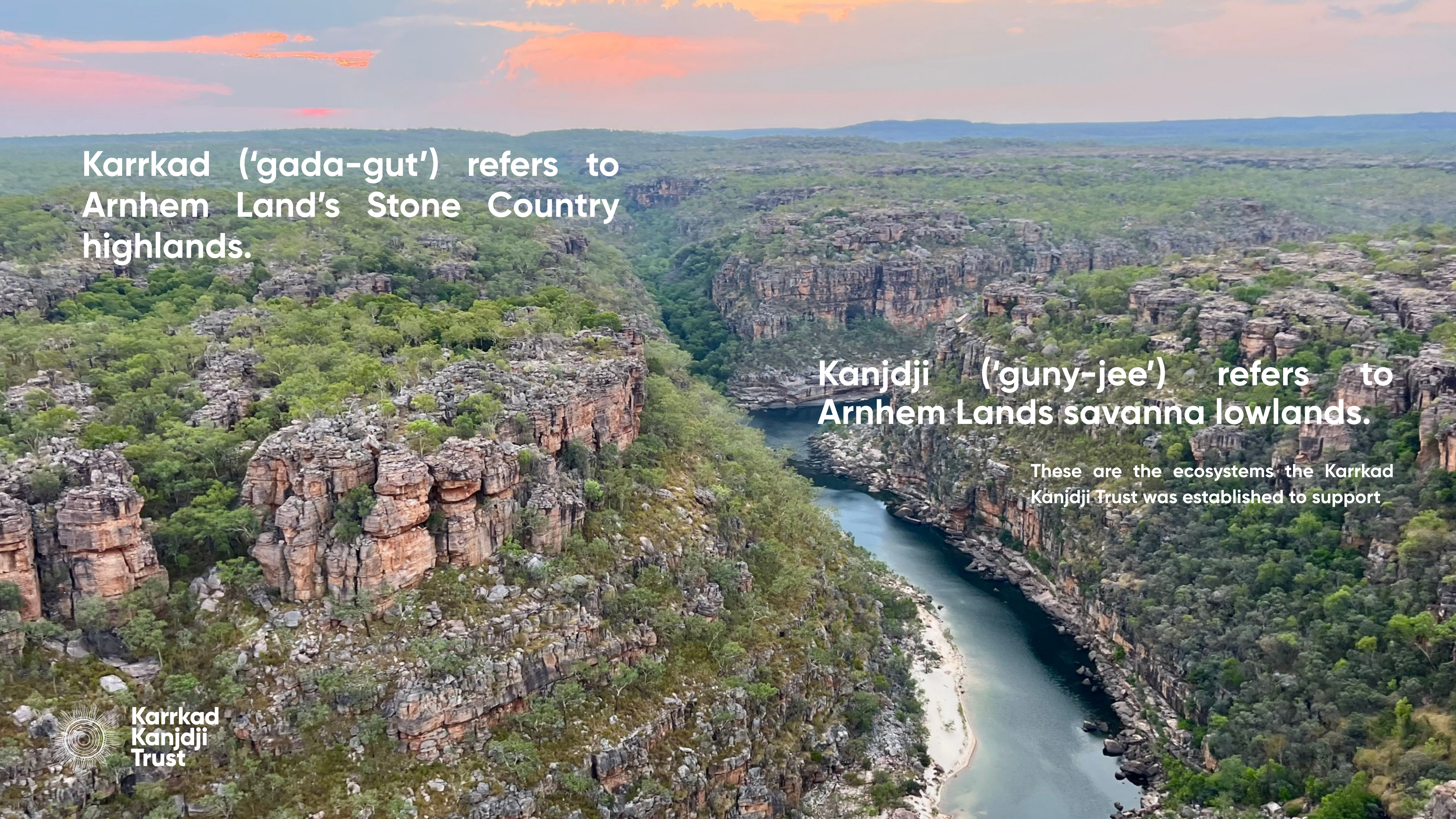

The Karrkad Kanjdji Trust (KKT) is a philanthropic trust that was established in 2010 by Traditional Owners of the Warddeken and Djelk Indigenous Protected Areas, to support their vision for healthy Country.

As custodians of much of West and Central Arnhem Land—one of the largest Indigenous estates in Australia—they recognised the potential strength and increased freedom and flexibility of alternative funding sources.

Across Arnhem Land, First Nations communities are delivering large-scale environmental, cultural and social outcomes through established, community-controlled systems.

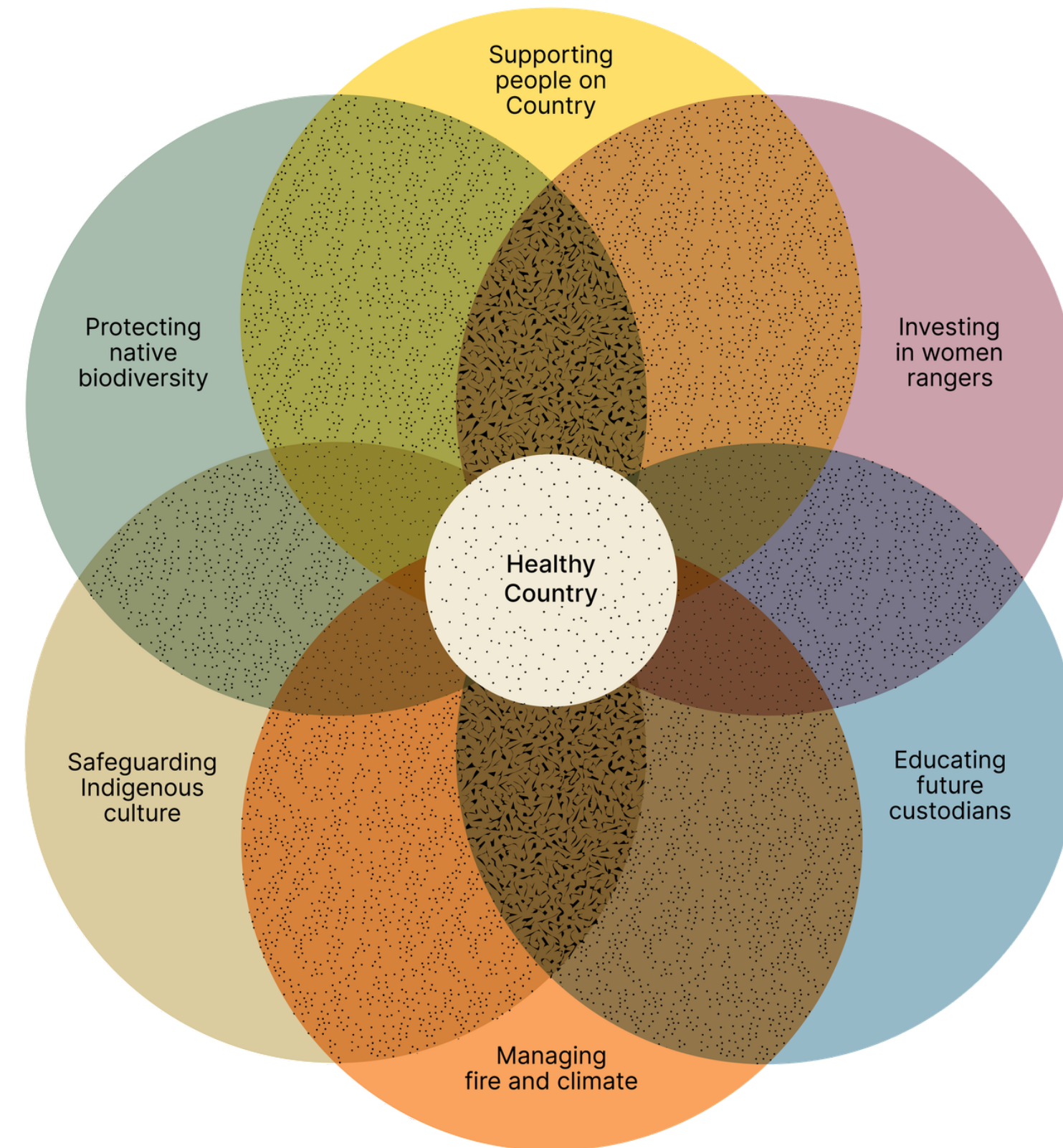

Partnership structure



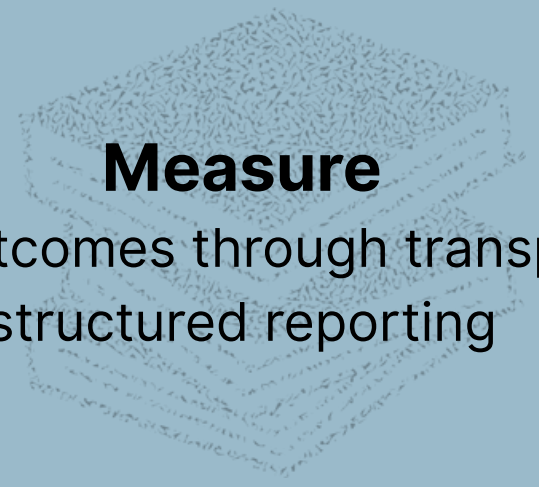

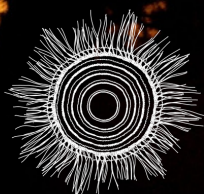

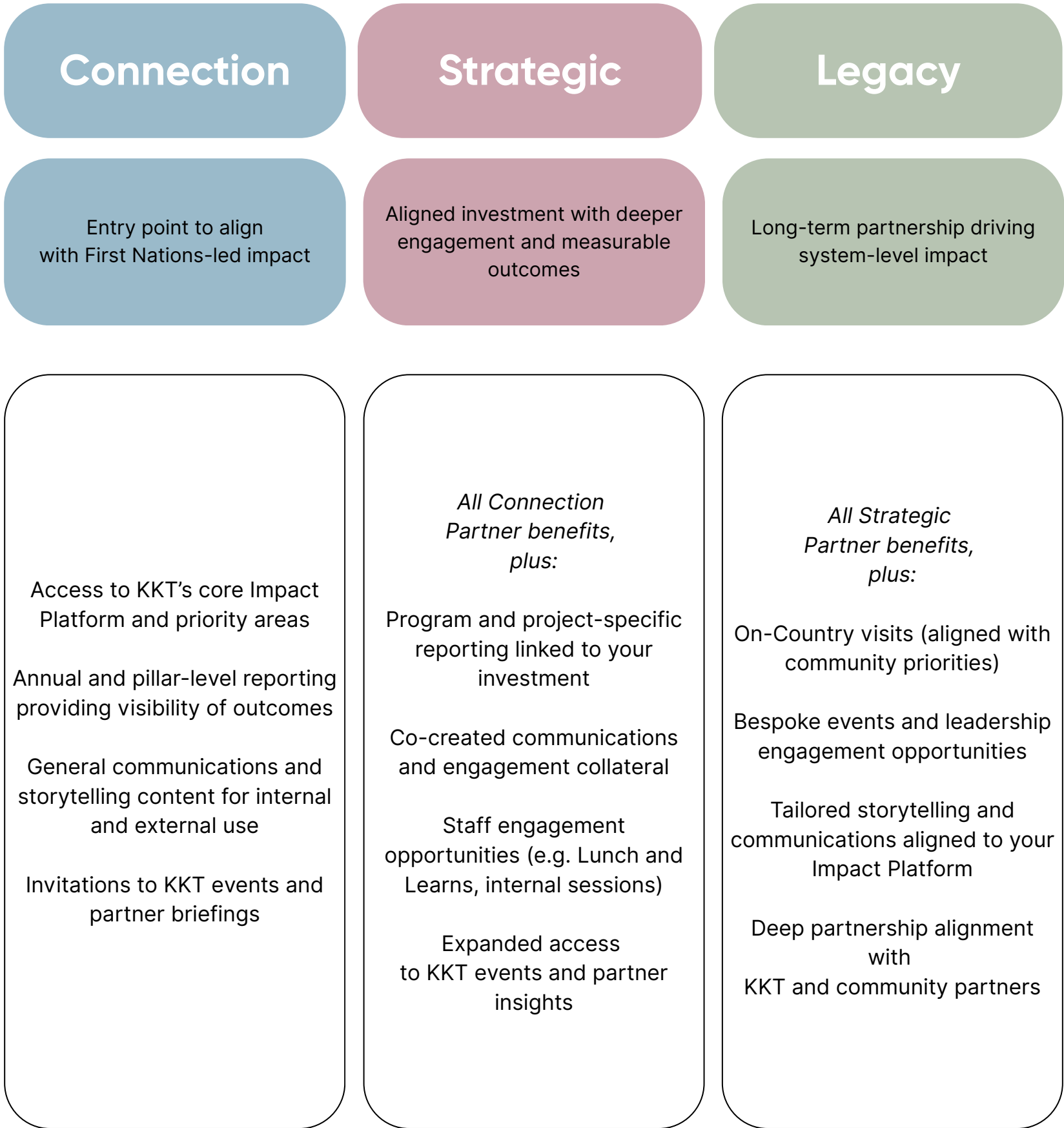
